## Non – Championship Classes

***The following classes are to be entered on the day of the show – the, sire/dam name and the names of his/her progeny are to be registered with the Chief Steward before the commencement of the judging of the Progeny Classes.***

***Entry Fee \$0***

- 503 Get of Dam (Suri) – This class is for the exhibiting of the progeny from the same dam. The dam is not shown. Progeny are shown in groups of two and can be of mixed sex, age and colour but must have been shown in their respective *Championship* classes at the same show. Progeny can be owned by different exhibitors.
- 504 Get of Dam (Huacaya) - details as above
- 505 Sires Progeny (Suri) – This class is for the exhibiting of progeny from the same sire. The sire is not shown. Progeny are shown in groups of two and can be of mixed sex, age and colour but must have been shown in their respective *Championship* classes at the same show. Progeny can be owned by different exhibitors.
- 506 Sires Progeny (Huacaya) – details as above

**This show is run under the Rules and Regulations of AANZ.**

### **Conditions of entry:**

This is a "Short Fleece Competition for Huacaya". All Huacaya alpaca must have a maximum fleece length of 60 mm and a minimum recommended fleece length of 30 mm.

All animals must belong to a clear TB herd where whole herd testing is performed in accordance with AANZ voluntary scheme. Copies of current TB certificates to be enclosed with entry forms.

All alpacas entered must be registered with AANZ and carry a brass ear tag displaying its corresponding IAR number.

The exhibitor is the owner listed on the alpaca's registration certificate. In case of a registered lease the lessee is deemed the owner.

The age of the alpaca is its age on the day of the show.

All exhibitors and handlers must place their animals in the pens allotted by the Convenor.

Placement of animals in "trade pens" will only be done with the permission of the Chief Steward.

Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazards created or accidents illness or damage by the action of themselves or their animals at the show grounds.

Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without the express permission of the Chief Steward.

Only persons directly responsible for an exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

Dress code smart casual. No alpaca related logos other than the AANZ logo to be worn in the ring.

**No alpaca is to be removed prior to the completion of the Show except where permission is granted by the Chief Steward.**

### **YELLOW CARD AND FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES**

- i.** Yellow Card. This Show/Event supports the RAS "Yellow Card" system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulation/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the "Yellow Card" system is available to view on the RAS website - [www.ras.org.nz](http://www.ras.org.nz).
- ii.** Forbidden Substances - The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Forbidden Substance Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.
- iii.** Arrears - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
- iv.** Summary of RAS Resolution Process - the full process can be found on the RAS website [www.ras.org.nz](http://www.ras.org.nz). The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the Show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the Show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
