



TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR STUD SERVICE AUCTION

SELLER:

1. The seller may elect to set a reserve, which will be disclosed to the auctioneer before start of bidding.
2. The seller acknowledges that all proceeds from the stud service auction go to the AANZ for the credit of the National Show budget.
3. At the fall of the hammer, the donating farm has committed to providing an on farm (where male resides) stud service to the winning bidder.
4. The donating farm agrees to provide the winning bidder with a live cria guarantee up to seven days from birth. If the female bred to the donated sire does not have a live cria after that seven day time frame the donating farm will offer on farm stud service to the same female. Any substitution of a female, after the original mating, will be at the sole discretion of the donating farm.
5. The donating farm is to be reasonable in finding suitable times for the winning bidder's female to be mated. A suitable area for the drive by mating must be provided by the donating farm that is clean, secure and non-contiguous with other animals.
6. The donating farm has the right to reject any female that is presented for mating that is over fleeced, too young or shows signs of sickness and/or disease.

BUYER:

1. Any successful bid for a stud service at the Saturday night dinner auction is a commitment to purchase the drive by stud service for the fee listed plus GST.
2. If you are the winning bidder, an email confirming the final bid will be sent to you with an attached invoice from the Alpaca Association NZ Inc. The invoice is payable within 14 days.
3. The purchased stud service is to be taken in 2025/2026 unless otherwise agreed to by the donating farm.



4. The donating farm may have their own bio-security practices and terms and conditions for drive by servicing, so it is advised that any bidders should ask about these before placing a bid.
5. All stud services are sold with a 7 day minimum live cria guarantee meaning that if the female presented for service does not produce a live cria for more than 7 days after birth, they shall be entitled to have the same female serviced again.
6. The winning bidder must be reasonable when arranging a date and time for the stud service to be carried out.
7. The female being presented for mating must have been shorn earlier that same year.
8. If three matings have been carried out and the female fails to conceive the owner is required to have a Vet investigate why. The owner of the female is required to report the findings to the stud male's owner. If treatable the female can be presented again. If untreatable an exchange can be done for another suitable female.
9. The buyer may not transfer their winning bid to another stud/breeder.
